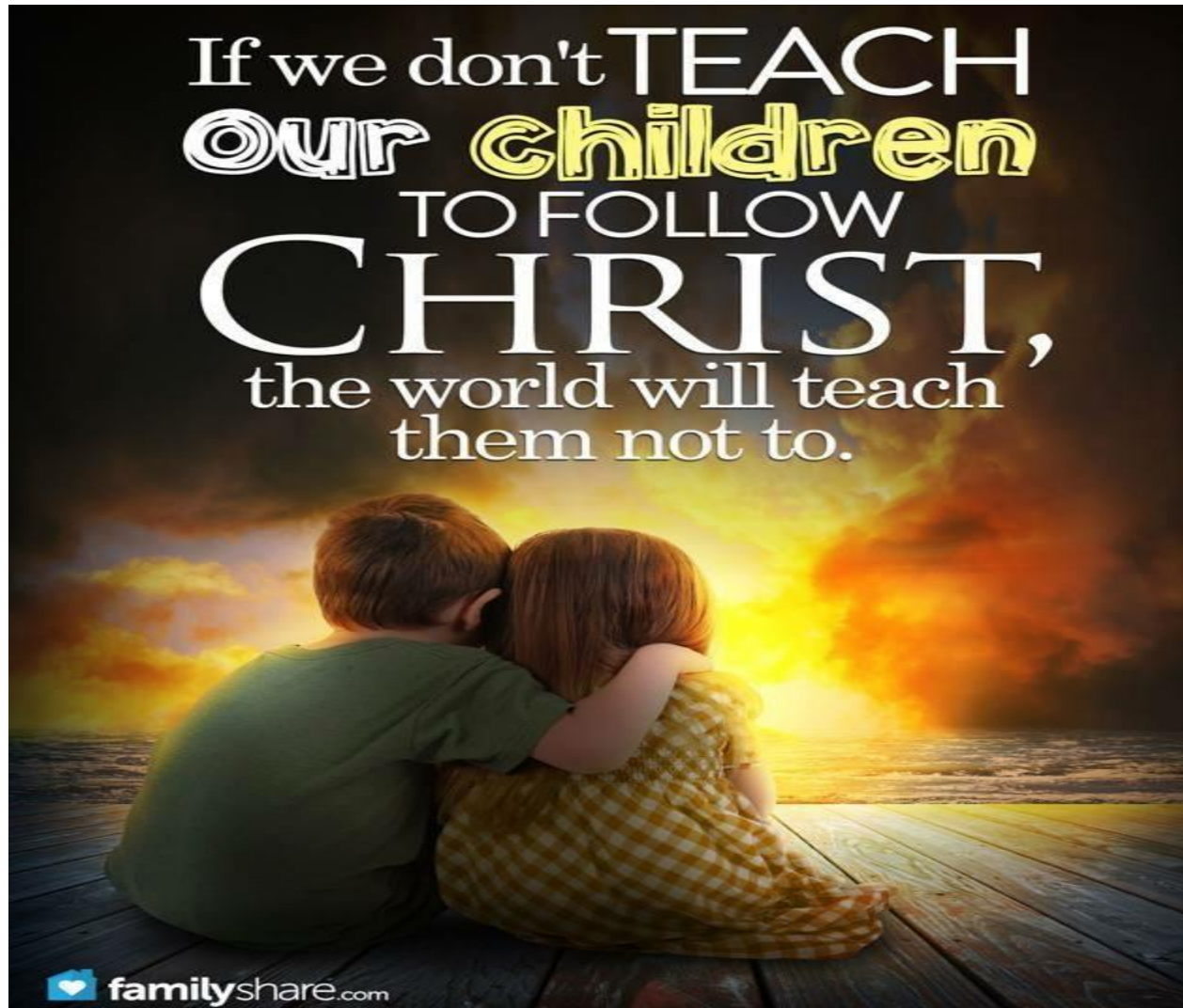

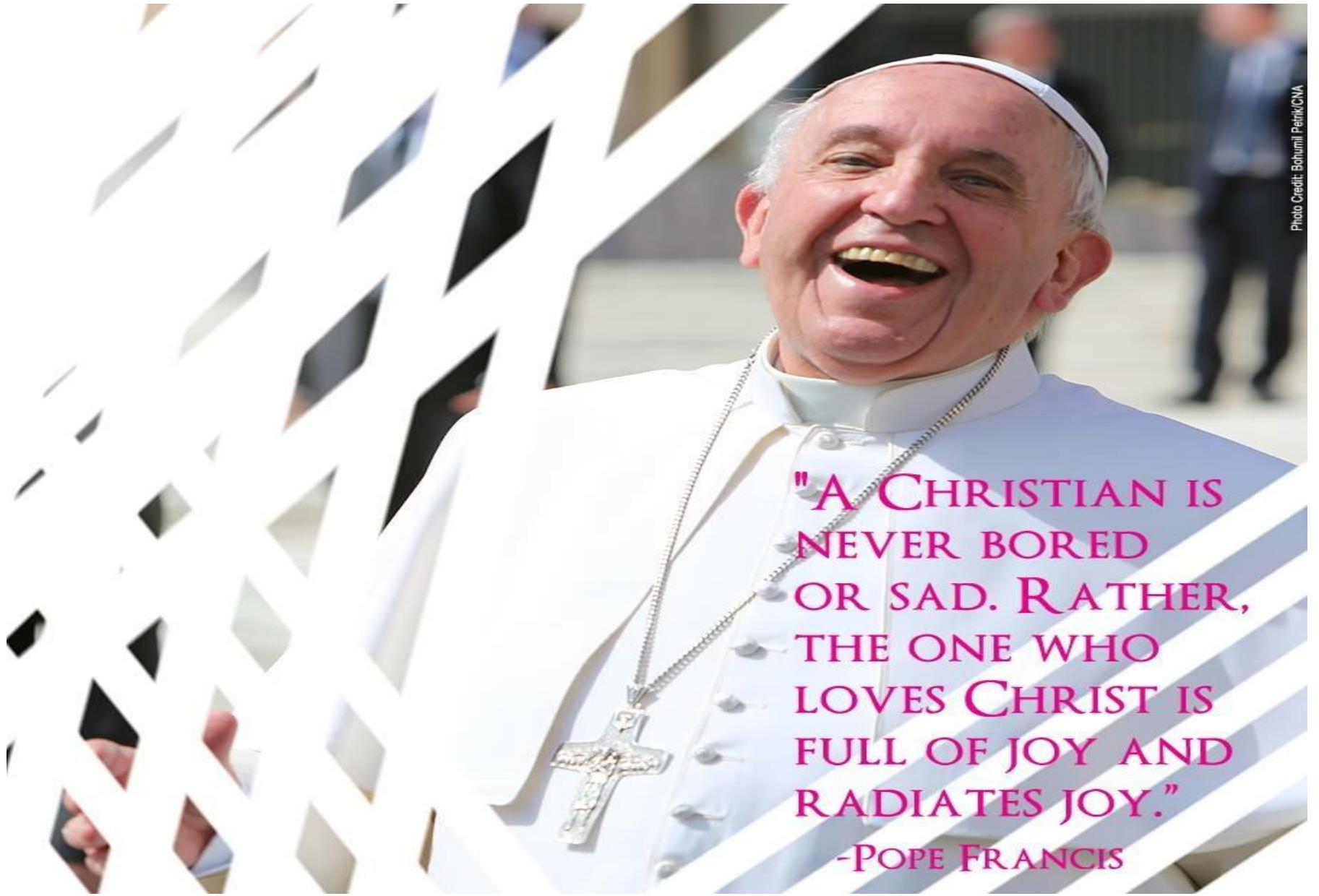

# *The Joy of the Gospel*

We must “...help believers to grow spiritually so that they can respond to God’s love ever more fully in their lives...” and reach out to “...the baptized whose lives do not reflect the demands of Baptism, who lack a meaningful relationship to the Church and no longer experience the consolation born of faith.” (EG, 15)


“I dream of a ‘missionary option,’ that is, a missionary impulse capable of transforming everything, so that the Church’s customs, ways of doing things, times and schedules, language and structures can be suitably channeled for the evangelization of today’s world rather than for her self-preservation.” (EG, 27)

“To be evangelizers of souls, we need to develop a spiritual taste for being close to people’s lives and to discover that this is itself a source of greater joy. To be Mission is at once a passion for Jesus and a passion for his people.” (EG, 268)

“It is striking that even some who clearly have solid doctrinal and spiritual convictions fall into a lifestyle which leads to an attachment to financial security, or to a desire for power or for human glory at all cost, rather than giving their lives to others in mission. Let us not allow ourselves to be robbed of missionary enthusiasm.” (EG, 80)


